

Creating and Collecting Materials

Material to Read/Explore

Examples from the Pandemic Histories Archive Project, including a list of possible material types (e.g. oral histories, field notes, photographs) and appraisal checklist for assessing whether materials are appropriate to submit to UCI Libraries Special Collections & Archives. This section also includes a book excerpt with guidance on writing ethnographic fieldnotes, and a link to the UCI DocuSign page. DocuSign can be used for signing documents, such as consent forms, electronically. Preparing an Oral History

This section provides resources for conducting oral history interviews. If you intend for students to conduct interviews, we highly recommend exploring the UCI Libraries oral history toolkit,

which provides a plethora of information on what oral histories are, how to design them, how to prepare and conduct an interview, and what to do after the interview.

Sample Forms and Instructions

Forms

Samples of an interview consent form, photograph consent form, and narrator biographical survey. Narrator biographical surveys can include biographies of anyone involved in the archive, such as the students creating materials and their interviewees.

Supplemental Materials for Oral Histories

Additional samples of supplemental materials for the interview, including an abstract, time log, and field notes.

Submitting to an Archive

Examples of how materials can potentially be submitted to UCI Libraries, by having students sign a gift waiver and following specific folder and file naming conventions.
